September Artist—Fred Dingler

We're pleased to host Fred Dingler as our demonstrator for the September meeting. Fred studied art at The American Academy of Art in Chicago. He feels very fortunate to have had Irving Shapiro as his Illustration and Watercolor instructor. After graduation he began a 40-year Illustration career here in the Twin Cities. In 1981 he

became a part-time instructor at the College of Visual Arts in St. Paul. He taught Illustration, Advanced Figure Drawing, and Watercolor for 11 years. In 1991 he began doing Sports Art for

Kelly-Russell Studio and in 1995 was hired full-time to organize the art department and develop new talent.

Upon retiring he started teaching adult open studio classes at the Minnesota River School. He has had classes at the Northfield Art Center and the Bloomington Art Center. He is now teaching classes in his studio in Burnsville. Fred's mediums are alkyd oil, acrylic, and watercolor and his painting style is realistic. The artists he most admires are James Toogood, Dean Mitchell, Peter Sculthorpe, Phil Austin and Hugh Greer.

MESSAGE from the President



Hello everyone, hope your summer didn't go too fast.

I love road trips, always have. At the end of August my father and I are going to take a doozie. We are going to Wyoming to look for things: jade, agates, dinosaur bone, essentially, whatever we come across. My dad has a fondness for apple-green nephrite jade. You see we are both blessed, or my wife would say cursed, with the collector gene. When you take a trip some-

times the destination (Wall Drug) is a let down, but the memories come from the odd little side trips or the experiences you make along the way.

You need to think of the painting process like a road trip. Many times in the classes and workshops that I teach, I see beginners desperately trying to leave the class with a good painting... (this is human nature, we all want success) But they try so hard they don't enjoy the journey. The artist who embraces the unique qualities of watercolor and just lets things happen, is usually rewarded. I know this is easier said than done. The late great Edgar Whitney writes, "The artist practicing his craft sometimes understands the most profound truth of all: results are unimportant. The value is in the activity." If you love the process, the destination takes care of itself and the entire trip becomes more memorable.

Professional artists (me) are often conflicted souls. The end result of a painting must be highquality and saleable. Many times I sit down at my drawing board, I want to make a great painting, I need to make a great painting, I need inventory to sell...and out comes an uninspired, overworked dud. Other times, I relax, observe, and play. I embrace the process, and then the magic happens.

So the next time you are traveling or painting don't ask, "are we there yet,... are we there yet?" Enjoy what you are doing, observe, study, learn. The more we observe the more we truly "see." The more you practice seeing and painting the more confident and intuitive you get, personal styles get created and techniques become second-nature. You realize the journey or road trip is so much fun, you don't care if you reach your destination.


