February Guest Speaker Fred Somers



From his childhood home in Nebraska, Fred Somers loved the outdoors and imagined being one of the explorer-artists who helped introduce the world to the wonders of the West. After graduating from the University of Iowa with MA and MFA in art Fred taught at both Carleton and St. Olaf colleges in Northfield, Minnesota.

Since 1975 he has pursued a career as a freelance artist, developing his farm-home art studio, Somers Studio and Gallery. He has taught workshops in the US and in Sweden and has work included in more than 400 public, private, and corporate collections.

Through the years he continues to hike the countryside, especially along waterways and to bring his discoveries into his oil and pastel paintings. With a 2008 grant from the Southeastern

Goodbye Slides

The spring show is fast approaching and this year we will be using a digital entry process instead of slides. Some members will say "oh no not that!" many others will say—"it's about time for the change." I am not a computer geek and need to rely on my wife Kim "the computer guru" for help. For past shows we sent in an image before a deadline. This year will be no different, except our image will be on a cd rather than a slide. Film cameras and especially slide film development are becoming obsolete. Kind of like my record player and my Pong video game. Most of the places you went to get slides before can provide you with the digital services you need. Many people

will be able to shoot their painting, load the image onto the computer, burn it on a disc and never leave the house. Others can take their memory cards from their digital camera to a photo kiosk at a Target or a Walgreen's etc. and put their image on a disc there. (Employees can guide you through this process.) Here are two options to have your work shot and put on disc in the twin cities area. (Essentially you drop off your painting and then pick up your painting and disc.)

from the President

After taking several weeks off from painting during the holidays, I am back in the studio and trying to find my direction once again. We were fortunate to be able to spend a family vacation in Paris over the holidays and I went with hopes for all kinds of inspiration. The weather reports predicted only sunshine and mild temperatures. In actuality, the weather was gray, sleeting and not

so mild! I was disappointed not to have the sunshine to accentuate the architecture and beautiful sites of the city. The nighttime scenes were the most spectacular. After a couple of days of nasty weather, and feeling somewhat uninspired, we went to visit the Musee de l'Orangerie. This is a small museum by any standard, but very petit by Paris standards. It houses the eight panels of Monet's Les Nympheas. He gave these to the French government and requested that they be hung in two oval rooms. A step inside these rooms transports one to another world. The canvases are so inspiring, that words fail me. This was a highlight of the trip for the entire family. Monet's inspiration for the pieces was his water garden at Giverny, which he painted over a period of 30 years. I have seen his smaller canvases of water lilies, but never such large ones or in such a setting as this.

It got me to thinking about inspiration and what makes us want to paint something. I have been inspired many times by a new snow fall on a sunny afternoon. The colors of the shadows are wonderful and make me want to put it on paper. I am inspired by shadows that describe form or create unusual patterns or by sunlight shining through the branches of trees, creating patterns on leaves or silhouetting the branches. I am inspired by light and watercolor gives me the tools to create that on paper. None of this is earth-shaking material but it fascinates me and I want to describe it with paint. In Paris, I was inspired by the night time lights and beauty of the city. I would like to try to capture this but it is a new direction for me, and a bit scary. I have already attempted one scene (and failed) I will re-try it with some new insight into what went wrong. I could go on forever, painting what I know well and what sells for me, but I would not grow as an artist if I did not try some new directions that challenge me. We will fail on the first attempts, but by learning from our mistakes, we will be able to succeed in this new direction. Too often I am afraid to try something difficult because I need a certain number of paintings for a show or I need a great new piece for a competition and I am afraid to "waste" my time on something if it might not succeed. But some of my best pieces have been experiments in a new direction. Join me in this new year and take on a challenge, something you have been avoiding because you are afraid it might not work. It just might work!
