

Fun with YUPO! Jim Turner's September 10 Demo

September 10 is the first MNWS meeting of the fall season. Watch and learn as Jim Turner, in his demonstration, reveals the fun of working with YUPO as a painting surface. Jim will be introducing us to the variety of ways one can work on YUPO, both abstractly and objectively, including pouring, tilting, lifting, rolling, "squeegeeing," spraying, stamping, etc. He will show how he creates beautiful small paintings and cards, and he will bring along finished paintings that illustrate many of the concepts.

YUPO is Jim's "go to" surface when he just wants to play with color and have some fun without the pressure of having to produce a big "Work of Art." He says, "you can easily have success without a lot of experience, if you define success as learning something new and having fun."

Jim Turner is a full-time physician and part-time painter. He has been painting in watercolor for about 20 years and it has become more and more of a passion



for him. He has no formal art education, but has learned from many world-class painters in a

variety of workshops. He loves to paint en plein air, combining a passion for the outdoors with his passion for painting. He also loves trying new techniques, new

materials, absorbing new ways of visualizing a scene, or of capturing the essence of an image or idea. "I think my paintings today are quite different from those I was making even a few years ago," he says, "and I hope the same is true a few years from now. It is this constant growth and change that makes art so fascinating and challenging, and keeps us all young!"

Hello Members!

It's hard to believe another summer has flown by! I hope you found time to paint indoors or outside these past weeks and have accomplished some of your painting goals. Unfortunately, I've been unable to get to most of the goals I'd set for myself this summer. These

last few weeks I've spent more time inside a hospital room than out of one. My daughter became very sick in early June and is just now beginning to recover.

I bring this up not to burden any of you but to explain a bit about the content of this column. Although I haven't had much time to paint, I've had a lot of time to *think* about painting. I've rediscovered that watercolor is incredibly beautiful with very little or no manipulation. Of course I knew this before but my lack of will to do much else to the paper has reminded me of some of my most favorite qualities of watercolor. I haven't finished any paintings and right now I don't really care about that. I know that what happens in our lives affects our art and I've no doubt that this is true for me regarding this summer.

Eligibility: "Brilliant Passages" is a non-juried show that is open to all Minnesota Watercolor Society members in good standing who have paid their dues through May 31, 2015. Each member may enter one painting. You may join the Minnesota Watercolor Society or renew your membership by sending a separate check for the membership dues with your entry form and entry fee by the deadline date October 14, at midnight.

<u>Award Juror</u>: Sally Johnson is our juror for awards. She has been the owner and curator of Groveland Gallery on Groveland Avenue in Minneapolis since 1983. Sally is highly respected in Minneapolis and St. Paul and has juried many exhibits.

<u>Awards</u>: Awards will be given in the following categories: Best of Show, Emerich/Stordahl Founder's Award, First, Second and Third Honors, Honorable Mention, Award of Merit and People's Choice.

Specifications: All paintings must be original, two-dimensional works in water-based media on a paper surface (including YUPO), that may or may not be altered (e.g., gesso, gel medium), or on canvas or board that has been treated or coated to accept watermedia, applied in a transparent or opaque manner (no impasto acceptable), and may be finished with acrylic protection versus glass. Collage (no found materials acceptable), if used, must be treated with water media only and subordinate to the overall painting. Drawing elements (ink, pastel, crayons, pencil, etc.) are acceptable. Copies of other artists' work will not be accepted, nor will copies of published photos or work from photos not taken by the artist. Paintings must have been completed within the last two years, and not done in a workshop or under the supervision of an instructor. Works previously shown in a MNWS exhibition are not eligible. Ames Center will not accept depictions of nude figures in their gallery.

Deadline: Entries must be postmarked by October 14, 2015, and completed in full. Space is limited to the first 65 paintings so enter early. Entries post-marked later than October 14, 2015 will not be included in the show, and will be returned.

Fees and How to Enter:

1. Register online or print out and mail in your entry form. Links to both can be found at **www.minnesotawatercolors.com** on the home page. (All dimensions should be given to the nearest inch.)

2. Pay \$20 entry fee via PayPal when you register OR mail a check. Make checks payable to Minnesota Watercolor Society. Enclose a separate check for new or renewal membership dues (\$30 single; \$40 couple/family, \$25 senior (65 or older), if necessary.

3. Email digital images to Suzi at **suzimcardlehood@gmail.com.** 1 MB max image size. Add name of work to JPEG image. Be sure to add the image name to your registration form with your name (ties your painting to your registration).

<u>Sales</u>: Paintings may be offered for sale or "Not for Sale" (NFS). Sales will be handled by MNWS, with a 20% commission to the Ames Center. The Ames Center does not cover artwork insurance but will take reasonable care in the handling and securing of your work during the exhibit. Artists will sign an insurance release form at drop off.

Delivery of Artwork: Monday, November 2, between 9:00 am and noon at the Ames Center.

Matting and Framing Requirements:

- White, off-white and light colored neutral mats only. No colored mats.
- Frames must be simple and sturdy and have wire and hooks mounted as specified in the diagram.
- If overall dimension is greater than 53" work must be covered in Plexiglas, no glass in large dimensions.
- Recommended: Rubber pads on bottom corner
- Attach the Exhibition ID Label to the back top left of your artwork.
